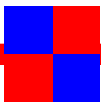

**SERVICE-CONNECTED
DISABILITY COMPENSATION**

This pamphlet is designed to inform you about service-connected disability compensation benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The information is not regulatory and should not be interpreted as such.

I. DISABILITY COMPENSATION DESCRIPTION

Disability Compensation: is a tax free monetary benefit paid to Veterans with disabilities that are the result of a disease or injury incurred or aggravated during active military service. Compensation may also be paid for post-service disabilities that are considered related or secondary to disabilities occurring in service and for disabilities presumed to be related to circumstances of military service, even though they may arise after service. Generally, the degrees of disability specified are also designed to compensate for considerable loss of working time from exacerbations or illnesses.

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC): is a tax free monetary benefit generally payable to a surviving spouse, child, or parent of Service-members who died while on active duty, active duty for training, or inactive duty training or survivors of Veterans who died from their service-connected disabilities. DIC for parents is an income based benefit.

Special Monthly Compensation (SMC): is an additional tax-free benefit that can be paid to Veterans, their spouses, surviving spouses and parents. For Veterans, Special Monthly Compensation is a higher rate of compensation paid due to special circumstances such as the need of aid and attendance by another person or a specific disability, such as loss of use of one hand or leg. For spouses and surviving spouses, this benefit is commonly referred to as aid and attendance and is paid based on the need of aid and attendance by another person.

II. Eligibility

Compensation benefits require that your disability be service-connected. You must also have separated or been discharged from service under other than dishonorable conditions.

Disability Compensation: Your disability must be the result of an injury or disease that was incurred or aggravated while on active duty or active duty for training; or from injury, heart attack, or stroke that occurred during inactive duty training. A disability can apply to physical conditions, such as Lou Gehrig's Disease, as well as mental health conditions, such as post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).



Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC): Surviving spouses of a Service-member who died on active duty, active duty for training, or inactive duty for training may be eligible for DIC. Children may be eligible for DIC if not included in the surviving spouse's DIC benefit.

Special Monthly Compensation Disability (SMC): compensation recipients may be eligible for this additional tax-free benefit due to the special circumstances of your disability, if you are housebound, or need help performing daily living functions.

III. How to File

Our office is able to assist you with your application.

The best way to apply is to come into your local County Veterans Service Office.

When applying for compensation benefits, you must have access to the following information:

- **Service Medical Records:** If not available, VA will request the records from the Service Department.
- **Other Medical Records:** Medical records to substantiate treatment by private doctors and/or hospitals. VA will obtain medical treatment records from VA medical centers if advised of such treatment.
- **Dependency Documents:** If available, photocopies of birth and marriage certificates and, Social Security Numbers for all current dependents and information of past marriages for both veterans and current spouse.
- **Military Discharged DD-214:** If not available, VA will obtain verification of military service.

- Veterans who have service-connected disabilities evaluated at 30% or more are entitled to additional allowances for dependents.

- Additional amounts are also payable for a spouse who is in need of the aid and attendance of another person.
- Higher rates are paid when the eligible veteran is determined to have suffered certain specific, severe disabilities.



These are all decided on an individual basis. Federal law prohibits the award of VA disability compensation concurrently with military pay, except to the extent that retirement pay is waived or military pay is offset.

VETERANS CURRENTLY IN RECEIPT OF VA COMPENSATION Veterans who are currently receiving service-connected disability compensation are entitled to make application for an increase if their current disability have worsened. **Caution:** It is possible that disability ratings can be reduced if it is found by the evidence of record that your disability have gotten better. Statutory Protections exist when ratings have been in effect for 20 or more years, even if the disability has improved. In order to make application for an increase, it is necessary that the veteran show medical proof of the worsened condition. Assistance in making application for an increase in service-connected disability ratings, as well as for any other benefits you may be entitled to, is available from your local County Veterans Service Office at, 1-877-OHIO-VET (644-6838).
